Alan Mittelman holds the Aaron Rabinowitz and Simon H. Rifkind Chair in Jewish Philosophy at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America. He teaches in the areas of modern Jewish thought, ethics, political philosophy, and philosophy of religion. Prof. Mittelman is the author of six books, most recently *Human Nature and Jewish Thought: Judaism's Case for Why Persons Matter* (2015). Among his other books are *A Short History of Jewish Ethics* (2012) and *Hope in a Democratic Age* (2009). His latest volume *Does Judaism Condone Violence? Holiness and Ethics in the Jewish Tradition* will appear later this year with Princeton University Press. He is the editor of five books, most recently *Holiness in Jewish Thought* (Oxford University Press, 2018).
